The Fiscal Court in and for Todd County met in regular session at the Courthouse at 9:00 a.m. and the following proceedings were had: The following Magistrates were present:

The Court opened with the pledge of allegiance, followed by a prayer by Squire Spurlin.

- Pastor Ted Beam, invited the Court to attend bacculaureate on Wednesday May 16th at 7pm at the high school.

- Upon motion of Squire Spurlin, seconded by Squire Johnson, it is hereby ordered to approve the April 13, 2012 Fiscal Court minutes and file.

Passed on a voice vote

- Upon motion of Squire Turner, seconded by Squire Camp, it is hereby ordered to approve transfers for April 27, 2012.

- Accounts Payable was presented to the Court for review and it is hereby ordered to file and pay all bills subject to state audit.

- Judge Greenfield requested that blacktop funds be used to blacktop a portion of Collier Springs Road where the new bridge was installed. The court agreed.

- Judge Greenfield requested that we order new trash cards for the 2012-13 year and begin selling them at the \$36.00/year rate and add \$3.00 per month to cover the remaining portion of the 2011-12 cards. The court agreed.

- Upon motion of Squire Blake, seconded by Squire Johnson, it is hereby ordered to approve the purchase of a 40 yard container from Municipal Equipment for \$7668.08.

- County Attorney, Mac Johns, reported that on April 16th, delinquent tax records were turned over to the Clerk. On April 19th, Mr. Johns office mailed out 346 letters. Of those letters, 35 were returned as undeliverable and 11 requested a payment plan.

- Jailer, Greg Allen, reported that they are currently housing 73 State Inmates and 25 County Inmates. He also noted that they are in the process of restructuring their work release program to better serve the County.
