The Fiscal Court in and for Todd County met in regular session at the Courthouse at 9:00 a.m. and the following proceedings were had. The following Magistrates were present:

Alfred Blake, Rex Johnson, John Camp, Jimmy Turner and Brent Spurlin

The Court opened with the pledge of allegiance, followed by a prayer by Judge Greenfield.

- Greg Meredith, Brian Dye and Justin Young from the Kentucky Transportation Department presented the 2011-2012 Rural Secondary Program to the Court.
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- Upon motion of Squire Spurlin, seconded by Squire Camp, it is hereby ordered to approve the 02-11-11 Fiscal Court minutes and file.

Passed on a voice vote

- Upon motion of Squire Spurlin, seconded by Squire Turner, it is hereby ordered to approve transfers for February 25th, 2011.

- Accounts Payable was presented to the Court for review and it is hereby ordered to file and pay all bills subject to state audit.
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- Upon motion of Squire Turner, seconded by Squire Johnson, it is hereby ordered to approve the Ordinance 11-02, on 2nd reading, budget amendment.

- Todd County Treasurer, Tammy Robertson, reported that previous Sheriff Billy Stokes brought in a check for \$10,275.05 for excess fees for 2010 but has not brought in a yearly settlement. Mrs. Robertson also noted that Mr. Stokes tried to get his 4th Quarter Settlement ran in the Todd County Standard as the yearly settlement. Mrs. Robertson informed the Standard that the Court would not pay to have this done as it would cost the county a lot more than just running the summary of the yearly settlement.
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- Per Dispatch, E-Warrants are up and running.
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- Emergency Management Coordinator, Bradley Powell, noted that he will be out surveying any damage from last night's storms.
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- Upon motion of Squire Camp, seconded by Squire Spurlin, it is hereby ordered to approve the Ordinance 11-03, on 2nd reading, closing of Chapel Hill Road.

- County Attorney, Mac Johns, reported that there was a training last Friday on the new E-Warrants system and the system went live this past Wednesday.
 - Mr. Johns also noted that the Court will have to review County Districts this year to make sure population is equal based on the census.
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- Todd County Coroner, Robert Whitlesey, reported that he has had 4 deaths in the past month, up from the average.
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- A written report for the Jail was submitted, noting that there are currently 80 State and 30 County inmates currently being housed.
- Upon motion of Squire Spurlin, seconded by Squire Camp, it is hereby ordered to approve the transfer of (1) Mossberg Model 88 12 gauge shotgun to the Sheriff Department.

- Upon motion of Squire Camp, seconded by Squire Johnson, it is hereby ordered to approve resolution 10-08, giving the Sheriff authority to apply for grant.

- Judge Greenfield reported that Scott Murphy has resigned from the Elkton City-Todd County Park Board.
 - Mr. Greenfield noted that he has appointed Kenny Griggs to the Park Board with a term to expire 12-31-12.
 - Mr. Greenfield added that he will have an update on the Park Board at the next meeting.
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- Squire Spurlin noted that citizens need to be aware of the importance of posting their address where it can be seen from the road.
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- Upon motion of Squire Johnson, seconded by Squire Blake, it is hereby ordered to approve the KACo insurance value committee recommendations.

- Judge Greenfield noted that there will be an Earthquake planning meeting in Bowling Green on March 9th at 10:00 am.
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- Upon motion of Squire Blake, seconded by Squire Johnson, it is hereby ordered to adjourn.
