The Fiscal Court in and for Todd County met in regular session at the Courthouse at 9:00 a.m. and the following proceedings were had. The following Magistrates were present:

The Court opened with the pledge of allegiance, followed by a prayer by Judge Greenfield.

- Todd County PVA, Perry Stokes, thanked Jailer Greg Allen, Deputy Brian Goff and the inmates for cleaning and painting in the Courthouse and asked that they be utilized more often in the Courthouse. Todd County Clerk, Kim Chapman agreed with Mr. Stokes.

- Upon motion of Squire Turner, seconded by Squire Spurlin, it is hereby ordered to approve the 01-14-11 Fiscal Court minutes and file.

Mrs. Robertson noted that the money for E Jefferson Davis and Stringtown Road has been received. Mrs. Robertson reported that \$181,744.00 is due to the County.

- Judge Greenfield noted that a heat unit has been down at the Senior Citizens Center.

- Judge Greenfield also noted that the County inventory list has been updated and he is currently checking in to the Earthquake Insurance being carried by the County.

- Judge Greenfield reported that he is looking into replacement lighting for the Courthouse. He has a bid of \$9500.00 for materials, to replace the current lighting with TVA offering \$1300.00 toward that cost.
  - Judge Greenfield is also looking into a grant to update the windows in the Courthouse.
