Regular Meeting
July 12, 2013, 9:00 a.m.

The Fiscal Court in and for Todd County met in regular session at the Courthouse at 9:00 a.m. and the following proceedings were had: The following Magistrates were present:

Alfred Blake, Rex Johnson, John Camp, Brent Spurlin and Jimmy Turner

The Court opened with the pledge of allegiance, followed by a prayer by Squire Spurlin.

- Upon motion of Squire Spurlin, seconded by Squire Johnson, it is hereby ordered to approve the June 28, 2013 Fiscal Court minutes and file.

Passed on a voice vote

- Accounts Payable was presented to the Court for review and it is hereby ordered to file and pay all bills subject to state audit.
- A list of standing orders for June was presented to the court.
- Upon motion of Squire Spurlin, seconded by Squire Turner, it is hereby ordered to approve the longevity raise for Pam Cook on July 1, 2013 to make her pay rate \$13.53/hour.

Passed on a voice vote

- Upon motion of Squire Camp, seconded by Squire Spurlin, it is hereby ordered to approve the longevity raise for Jeremy Barber on July 18, 2013 to make his pay rate \$10.93/hour.

- Dispatch coordinator, Karen Stratton, reported that the transition has gone smoothly and that they have been approved for a CMRS grant for a new CAD system.
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- Upon motion of Squire Spurlin, seconded by Squire Camp, it is hereby ordered to approve Resolution 13-05, to apply for a Homeland Security grant.

Passed on a voice vote

- Eddie Mitchell, Road Foreman, reported that bridge material has been delivered and the crew is beginning construction.
 - By consensus of the court, it is agreed to let the road department employees to work overtime in order to get caught up on county mowing and other responsibilities.
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- Upon motion of Squire Spurlin, seconded by Squire Camp, it is hereby ordered to approve raising the Coroner's vehicle budget to \$12,000.00 in order to find a suitable vehicle.

- A Sheriff's written report was presented to the court.
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- A written Jailer's report was presented to the court noting that they are currently housing 63 state and 22 county inmates.

- Food service bids were opened on Thursday, July 11 by the Jailer and the Judge.
- Upon motion of Squire Camp, seconded by Squire Turner, it is hereby ordered to approve the Kellwell food service agreement.
- Upon motion of Squire Camp, seconded by Squire Spurlin, it is hereby ordered to approve amendment of the Food Service motion to add that it is approved after the County Attorney approves the contract.

- Upon motion of Squire Camp, seconded by Squire Turner, it is hereby ordered to approve the Kellwell food service agreement, as amended.

Passed on a voice vote

- The magistrates are to review county roads in need of repair to be paid with county funds.
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- Upon motion of Squire Camp, seconded by Squire Blake it is hereby ordered to adjourn.
