Regular Meeting  
July 27, 2012, 9:00 a.m.

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The Fiscal Court in and for Todd County met in regular session at the Courthouse at 9:00 a.m. and the following proceedings were had: The following Magistrates were present:

Alfred Blake, Rex Johnson, John Camp, Jimmy Turner and Brent Spurlin

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The Court opened with the pledge of allegiance, followed by a prayer by Squire Spurlin.

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- Mr. Tony Powell addressed the court to express his displeasure over the way he was confronted about the scrap sheetrock that he had dumped on his land. Mr. Powell asked the court to look in to what is the county right of way and what his is personal property at this location.
  - Lonnie Campbell, of KACo and Keith, a representative of Civic Finance Advisors, presented the court with a refinance offer for the Jail that has lower long term rates. Mac will review the ordinance and report back to the court.
