

ORDERS

Todd County Fiscal Court

March 11, 2011

9:00 a.m.

The Fiscal Court in and for Todd County met in regular session at the Old Courthouse at 9:00 a.m. and the following proceedings were had. The following Magistrates were present:

Alfred Blake, Rex Johnson, John Camp, Jimmy Turner and Brent Spurlin

The Court opened with the pledge of allegiance, followed by a prayer by Squire Spurlin.

- Upon motion of Squire Spurlin, seconded by Squire Turner, it is hereby ordered to approve the 02-25-11 Fiscal Court minutes and file.

Passed on a voice vote

- Upon motion of Squire Turner, seconded by Squire Johnson, it is hereby ordered to approve transfers for March 11th, 2011.

Passed on a voice vote

- Accounts Payable was presented to the Court for review and it is hereby ordered to file and pay all bills subject to state audit.
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- Upon motion of Squire Camp, seconded by Squire Spurlin, it is hereby ordered to approve the February Financial Report subject to State Audit.

Passed on voice vote

- Todd County Treasurer, Tammy Robertson, reported that previous Sheriff Billy Stokes has \$9408.61 in outstanding unemployment benefits to be paid to the State. Mrs. Robertson stated that if the County does not pay this balance that the State will freeze all County money. She noted that Travis Harris and BJ Grayson are still receiving these benefits so until they find work, the County will be responsible for paying these benefits.

- Upon motion of Squire Turner, seconded by Squire Johnson, it is hereby ordered to approve paying the \$9408.61 due to the state for the previous sheriff's unemployment.

Passed on voice vote

- Mrs. Robertson also noted that the County will have to pay the previous sheriff's 2009 retirement that he did not pay even though the County gave him the money to do so.

- Mrs. Robertson further added that auditors have been requesting the previous sheriff's payroll and bank statements to close out the audit. Stokes has these records even though state law requires them to stay at the courthouse. Sheriff Joey Johnson states he will not accept these reports if Stokes brings them back due to Stokes having them for

such a long period of time and possibly altering the reports. County Attorney, Mac Johns, is to look into the matter.

- The 2010 Sheriff Tax Settlement submitted by the previous sheriff states that numerous taxing districts are still owed money. Mrs. Robertson will check to see if we can wait to pay these outstanding balances until the audit is complete.
- Upon motion of Squire Spurlin, seconded by Squire Camp, it is hereby ordered to approve the 2010 Sheriff Tax Settlement subject to state audit as well as paying these balances if need be.

Passed on voice vote

- Mrs. Robertson added that this will affect the County budget as there are no lines to cover these items.

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- A letter of resignation from Bradley Powell, Todd County EMA Director, Animal Control Office and Flood Plain Coordinator, was presented to the Court with his last day being today, March 11, 2011.

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- Upon motion of Squire Blake, seconded by Squire Johnson, it is hereby ordered to approve Resolution 11-09, Rural Secondary Program.

Passed on voice vote

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- Upon motion of Squire Spurlin, seconded by Squire Camp, it is hereby ordered to approve Resolution 11-11, CRA Funds.

Passed on voice vote

- Upon motion of Squire Turner, seconded by Squire Blake, it is hereby ordered to approve the CRA Contract.

Passed on voice vote

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- It was noted that Alonzo Wilson, Todd County Road employee, received his longevity pay raise in February.

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- Upon motion of Squire Camp, seconded by Squire Blake, it is hereby ordered to approve the purchase of an 8' grader at \$2600.00.

Passed on voice vote

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- Upon motion of Squire Camp, seconded by Squire Johnson, it is hereby ordered to approve Order 11-07, Appointing Eddie Mitchell as Todd County Solid Waste Coordinator with enforcement powers.

Passed on a voice vote

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- Todd County Clerk, Kim Chapman, reported that they are busy but the office is running smooth.
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- A written Jail report was submitted to the Court noting that there are currently 83 state and 33 county inmates being housed. The report also notes that the Jail scored 100% on the annual inspection.
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- A written Sheriff report was submitted to the Court. Sheriff Johnson also noted that he has hired Richard Barr as a full time deputy.
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- Upon motion of Squire Spurlin, seconded by Squire Camp, it is hereby ordered to approve Resolution 11-10, restructuring the Park Administrative Council.

Passed on a voice vote

- Judge Greenfield noted that he has appointed Andrea Jones to the Park Board with a term to expire December 31, 2011, Order 11-06.
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- Judge Greenfield thanked the Todd County Standard for their article regarding house numbers.
- Judge Greenfield congratulated the Lady Rebels Basketball team on their winning District.
- Upon motion of Squire Turner, seconded by Squire Blake, it is hereby ordered to approve changing the April 8th regular fiscal court meeting to a special meeting on April 11th at 9:00 am.

Passed on voice vote

- Upon motion of Squire Johnson, seconded by Squire Turner, it is hereby ordered to approve appointing Squires Spurlin and Camp to this year's budget committee with the Judge to have the Court be more involved in the budget planning.

Passed on voice vote

- Squire Johnson asked that anyone who could donate time or money to the Dream Riders Organization to please do so. Mr. Johnson stated that this is a good organization that helps many children.
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- Upon motion of Squire Blake, seconded by Squire Turner, it is hereby ordered to adjourn.
