

## ORDERS

Todd County Fiscal Court  
Regular Meeting  
March 9, 2012, 9:00 a.m.

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The Fiscal Court in and for Todd County met in regular session at the Courthouse at 9:00 a.m. and the following proceedings were had: The following Magistrates were present:

Alfred Blake, Rex Johnson, John Camp, Jimmy Turner and Brent Spurlin

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The Court opened with the pledge of allegiance, followed by a prayer by Judge Greenfield

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Greg Meredith, Bryan Dye, Tim Sharp and Justin Young from the Transportation Department presented the Court with the Rural Secondary Program projected funding for Todd County.

- Upon motion of Squire Turner, seconded by Squire Spurlin, it is hereby ordered to approve supporting the presented Rural Secondary Program projected funding.

Passed on a voice vote

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- Upon motion of Squire Johnson, seconded by Squire Camp, it is hereby ordered to approve the February 24, 2012 Fiscal Court minutes and file.

Passed on a voice vote

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- Upon motion of Squire Spurlin, seconded by Squire Turner, it is hereby ordered to approve transfers for March 9, 2012.

Passed on a voice vote

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- Accounts Payable was presented to the Court for review and it is hereby ordered to file and pay all bills, subject to state audit.
- Upon motion of Squire Blake, seconded by Squire Johnson, it is hereby ordered to approve the \$250.00 budgeted amount for Fairview Fire Department.

Passed on a voice vote

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- Upon motion of Squire Camp, seconded by Squire Turner, it is hereby ordered to approve the February Financial Report subject to State Audit.

Passed on a voice vote

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- Upon motion of Squire Camp, seconded by Squire Johnson, it is hereby ordered to approve the purchase of a LifPak Monitor by trading in the 2 old Phillips Monitors, using Senate 66 money as well as the Ambulance Equipment Line and the County paying the remaining \$3000.00.

Passed on voice vote

- Upon motion of Squire Spurlin, seconded by Squire Camp, it is hereby ordered to approve the purchase of a new computer for the training room from Computer Knights using LGEA funds.

Passed on a voice vote

- Upon motion of Squire Turner, seconded by Squire Camp, it is hereby ordered to approve the hiring of Amber Yoder as a part-time Paramedic at \$12.06/hour and James Durst as a part-time EMT at \$8.25/hr.

Passed on a voice vote

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- Dispatch Coordinator, Donna Ruby, reported that the Dispatch Center is NIMS compliant.
  - Upon motion of Squire Camp, seconded by Squire Blake, it is hereby ordered to approve moving Amanda Wilcher from part-time to full-time status at \$10.00/hr.

Passed on a voice vote

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- Judge Greenfield reminded magistrates to get in their Flex Money priority lists by the end of next week.

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- Judge Greenfield noted that the backup garbage truck's motor has blown and they are currently looking into other truck options.

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- The State's CPI (Consumer Price Index) recommendation for Magistrates, Coroner and County Attorney is set at 2.96%. Squire Spurlin noted that he cannot vote to give himself a raise when the County may not be able to give County employees a raise at budget time. Mr. Spurlin, however does make a motion to give the Coroner and the County Attorney the cost of living raise. This motion is withdrawn and changed to the following;
  - Upon motion of Squire Spurlin, seconded by Squire Camp, it is hereby ordered to approve cost of living raise at 2.96% for the Todd County Attorney, effective March 1st.

Passed on a voice vote

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- County Attorney, Mac Johns, reminds everyone that the tax season for the Sheriff is coming to an end, adding that stiff charges and penalties will be applied after April 15<sup>th</sup>.

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- A written Jail report was presented to the Court stating that 75 State and 18 County inmates are currently being housed.

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- Todd County Sheriff, Joey Johnson, reported that his secretary resigned on the past Friday and that he has hired Angela Leneave as her replacement.

- Upon motion of Squire Blake, seconded by Squire Turner, it is hereby ordered to approve the purchase of a new Chevy truck at State bid price for \$27,974.00 and then adding equipment for a total price of \$31,500.00 to be paid from the Donation Fund.

Passed on a voice vote

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- Judge Greenfield reported that unless the Magistrates disagreed, that an ad would be put in the Todd County Standard notifying citizens that penalties for the Net Profit Tax would be waived if paid in full by April 15<sup>th</sup>.
  - Judge Greenfield asked Magistrates to consider not applying the Net Profit Tax to those with gross earnings less than a certain minimum.
  - County Attorney, Mac Johns, added that he had met with Representative Tilley about the banning of Synthetic Drugs and asked that everyone be vocal about the dangers and to not contribute to those merchants who sell the drugs.
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- Upon motion of Squire Blake, seconded by Squire Camp, it is hereby ordered to adjourn.
