The Fiscal Court in and for Todd County met in special session at the Old Courthouse at 9:00 a.m. and the following proceedings were had: The following Magistrates were present:

Alfred Blake, Rex Johnson, John Camp, Brent Spurlin and Jimmy Turner

The Court opened with the pledge of allegiance, followed by a prayer by Squire Spurlin.

- Upon motion of Squire Camp, seconded by Squire Spurlin, it is hereby ordered to approve the November 4th, 2011 Fiscal Court minutes, with the correction of the Rescue Squad being granted permission to use the Emergency Management truck in case of emergency instead of reading vice versa, and file.

Passed on a voice vote

- Upon motion of Squire Spurlin, seconded by Squire Johnson, it is hereby ordered to approve transfers for November 18th.

Passed on a voice vote

- Accounts Payable was presented to the Court for review and it is hereby ordered to file and pay all bills subject to state audit.
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- Upon motion of Squire Camp, seconded by Squire Spurlin, it is hereby ordered to approve the 2010 Sheriff Audit and not to pursue the \$2517.00 from the Donation Account.

Passed on a voice vote

- Todd County Treasurer, Tammy Robertson, reported on the condition of the computers in the Judge's office as being out dated and not up to full working capacity. Mrs. Robertson noted that (3) new computers and (1) new desk will be purchased for approximately \$3600-\$3900.00 and be paid out of the LGEA fund which currently has nearly \$30,000.00 for such purchases. The Court had no objections.
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- Ambulance Director, Locky Beasley, reported that they have received their Wal-mart grant in the amount of \$500.00.
- Per Assistant County Attorney, Mark Collins, the 911 Billing contract will have to go out for bids before a new contract is signed.

- Mr. Beasley will advertise, at no charge, for new paramedics.
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- Upon motion of Squire Spurlin, seconded by Squire Turner, it is hereby ordered to approve moving Terrance Martin to full-time at \$10.00 per hour, moving Amanda Wilcher to part-time at \$8.25 per hour and hiring Angela Robertson as part-time at \$8.25 per hour.

Passed on a voice vote

- Donna Ruby, Dispatch Coordinator, reported that the radio issues with Mediacom have been resolved.
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- Judge Greenfield reported that paving is complete and bridge replacement/maintenance should begin soon.
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- Todd County Coroner, Bob Whittlesey, reported he has had (1) call since his last report.
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- Kim Chapman, County Clerk, reported that the election went smoothly and added that her office was selected to be audited for that election.
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- Greg Allen, Todd County Jailer, reported 76 State and 19 County inmates currently being housed. Mr. Allen also provided some changes for the Jail's Policy and Procedure manual for the Court to review.

- Upon motion of Squire Turner, seconded by Squire Camp, it is hereby ordered to approve the Jail taking 50% of inmate incoming money to cover the inmate's unpaid medical charges.

- Upon motion of Squire Blake, seconded by Squire Spurlin, it is hereby ordered to approve the Sheriff's Quarterly Report subject to State Audit.

Passed on a voice vote

- Upon motion of Squire Blake, seconded by Squire Turner, it is hereby ordered to approve paying Allegre Fire Department the budgeted \$500.00

- Judge Greenfield provided the Magistrates with a copy of the Southern Pennyryle Alliance Report.

- Judge Greenfield noted that our next meeting will be on the regular date with a decision on possibly holding a special meeting the last week of the year if needed, made at that time.
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- Upon motion of Squire Camp, seconded by Squire Blake, it is hereby ordered to adjourn.
