The Fiscal Court in and for Todd County met in regular session at the Courthouse at 9:00 a.m. and the following proceedings were had: The following Magistrates were present:

Alfred Blake, Rex Johnson, John Camp and Brent Spurlin

The Court opened with the pledge of allegiance, followed by a prayer by Squire Brent Spurlin.

- Upon motion of Squire Spurlin, seconded by Squire Blake, it is hereby ordered to approve the September 9th, 2011 Fiscal Court minutes, and file.

Passed on a voice vote

- Upon motion of Squire Camp, seconded by Squire Spurlin, it is hereby ordered to approve transferring \$300.00 from the Ambulance utility line 09-5140-5780 to the office supply line 09-5140-4450.

Passed on a voice vote

- Accounts Payable was presented to the Court for review and it is hereby ordered to file and pay all bills subject to state audit.
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- Upon motion of Squire Camp, seconded by Squire Johnson, it is hereby ordered to approve hiring James Dukes, William Kent and Jason Kurtz as part-time paramedics at \$12.06 per hour.

Passed on a voice vote

- Upon motion of Squire Spurlin, seconded by Squire Camp, it is hereby ordered to approve hiring Jared Sutherland as a part-time EMT at \$8.25 per hour.

Passed on a voice vote

- Upon motion of Squire Johnson, seconded by Squire Blake, it is hereby ordered to approve hiring Donnie Miller as a part-time EMT at \$9.25 per hour.

Passed on a voice vote

- Ambulance Director, Locky Beasley, presented the Court with ambulance monitor bids.
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- Dispatch Coordinator, Donna Ruby, reported that they are short staffed and also that they recently participated in a drill with Fort Campbell.
- Upon motion of Squire Spurlin, seconded by Squire Johnson, it is hereby ordered to approve raising Lindsey Seay's pay rate to \$11.00 per hour due to her completion of certification.

Passed on a voice vote

- Emergency Management Coordinator, Tim Pulley, reported that there had been a train derailment as well as a couple gas leaks in the County recently. All incidents were contained and handled appropriately.
 - Mr. Pulley also noted that the LEPC will be participating in a full scale earthquake exercise on October 15th at 9:00am in North Todd.
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- Upon motion of Squire Spurlin, seconded by Squire Blake, it is hereby ordered to approve pursuing a bridge grant for Colier Springs Road, Cardwell Road, Sawyer Road and Cordis Kenner Road.

Passed on a voice vote

- Judge Greenfield noted that with the closing of Todd County Crushed Stone, the road department has to travel to either Trenton or Greenville for stone. With the increase in distance, the County may have to look into updating its truck.
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- County Attorney, Mac Johns, updated the Court on the litigation with former Sheriff, Billy Stokes. Mr. Stokes was served on September 12th and has 20 days to respond.
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- A written Jail Report was presented to the Court noting 74 state and 20 county inmates are currently being housed. Jailer, Greg Allen, added that the enclosed GPS contract be tabled until a later date.
 - Mr. Allen added that new laundry and kitchen systems had been implemented in which he expects to save approximately \$5,000.00 per year.
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- Judge Greenfield requested the October 14th meeting be changed to a special meeting on October 7th. The court agreed.
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- Upon motion of Squire Spurlin, seconded by Squire Camp, it is hereby ordered to approve entering into closed session per KRS 61.810(1)(f) to discuss a specific employee issue.

Passed on a voice vote

- Upon motion of Squire Spurlin, seconded by Squire Blake, it is hereby ordered to approve coming out of closed session.

Passed on a voice vote

- Judge Greenfield noted that no action was taken on the issue discussed in closed session.
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- Upon motion of Squire Camp, seconded by Squire Blake, it is hereby ordered to adjourn.
